


#### **Migration to Germany**

#### People with a migration background in Germany

Long tradition of immigration:

1950ties-1973: Guest workers

1973-1990: family reunifications


1990ties: Asylum seekers and Aussiedler (ethnic Germans)


Since 2000s: new labour immigration from Eastern Europe

→ large share of people with a migration background:

In 2012, 20% of the German population had a migration background

#### **Concept of integration**

- Integration has multiple dimensions:
- o cultural
- o social
- o political
- o and economic integration
- Crucial for all four dimensions: labour market integration
- Aspects to consider:
- o Participation and outcomes
- Quantity and quality

### **Labour Market Outcomes: Employment**

| Germany       |                          |                        |
|---------------|--------------------------|------------------------|
|               | Unemployment rate (2013) | Employment rate (2012) |
| German men    | 6,4                      | 82,4                   |
| Foreign men   | 13,1                     | 79,4                   |
| German women  | 5,9                      | 73,3                   |
| Foreign women | 16,2                     | 57,8                   |

#### Main Challenge is....

#### **Education**

- Relative poor educational background of guest worker migrants from the 60ties and 70ties
- Lack of investment due to misconception of "guest workers"
- Underperformance of second-generation migrants
- o Social background influences educational outcomes
- Transferability of foreign skills
- o Insufficient recognition of foreign credentials and work experience
- Strong variation between cohorts, ethnicities and regions

#### Other challenges and (a subjective selection)

- o Immigration and citizenship laws
- o Discrimination
- Labour market entry (transition from school into the job market)
- o Persistence of unemployment and its implications
- Soft location factors ("Willkommenskultur")
- o Migrant specific services in job centers and public administration
- o Diversity Management
- Representation of people with migration background in the public sector
